

# Blue Lagoon *by Lily Go*

**Blue Lagoon Shawl** is a triangular shawl that can be made with only one skein of sock yarn. This shawl is crocheted from the neck down, and can be adjusted very easily depending on the amount of yarn you have. As with all my other patterns, this pattern comes with both written instructions and charts.



**Yarn:** For the blue shawl, I used Sundara Sock Yarn (Charcoal Over Blue Lagoon color) 1 skeins (100g, 370 yards). I had about 10 meters or 11 yards leftover.  
For the two tone grey color sample, I used 300 yards light grey, and 70 yards dark grey).

**Hook:** 4.5 mm (US G)

**Notions:** Removable stitch markers for crochet

**Gauge (for sock or fingering weight yarn):**

Mark your yarn 97 cm or 38" (stretched out). Within this 97 cm, you should be able to make exactly 10 dc or double crochet, otherwise adjust your hook size accordingly.

Note: exact gauge is not essential for a shawl - it just needs to be close enough to make sure you won't run out of yarn. If you are able to knit fewer stitches than those listed above, you will need more yarn to complete the shawl.

**Level:** Adventurous Beginner

**Finished Size:**

41" (104 cm) across top edge, 22" (56 cm) long from centre top to point

## Abbreviations



### **Chain Stitch (ch)**

catch yarn with hook and draw yarn through, repeat for desired number of st with consistent tension



### **Single Crochet (sc)**

insert hook in the specified place, yarn over and draw yarn through, yarn over and draw through 2 loops on hook



### **Double Crochet (dc)**

yarn over, insert hook in the specified place, yarn over and draw yarn through, yarn over and draw through 2 loops, yarn over and draw through remaining 2 loops



### **Treble Crochet (tr)**

yarn over 2 times, insert hook in the specified place, yarn over and draw yarn through, [yarn over and draw through 2 loops] 3 times.



### **Triple Treble Crochet (ttr)**

yarn over 4 times, insert hook in the specified place, yarn over and draw yarn through, [yarn over and draw through 2 loops] 5 times.



### **Double Crochet 3 Together (dc3tog)**

[yarn over, insert hook in the specified place, yarn over and draw yarn through, yarn over and draw through 2 loops] 3 times (4 loops on hook), yarn over and draw through all loops on hook



### **Double Crochet 4 Together (dc4tog)**

[yarn over, insert hook in the specified place, yarn over and draw yarn through, yarn over and draw through 2 loops] 4 times (5 loops on hook), yarn over and draw through all loops on hook

## Written Instructions

### Part A

*Note: place markers in the stitches marked in **red**, and remove markers when you come to them.*

**Row 1:** Ch6, (dc, ch1, dc, ch2, dc) in 1st ch.

**Row 2:** ch5, dc7 in ch2-sp, ch3, skip (dc, ch1, dc), (dc7, ch2, dc) in ch5-sp.

**Row 3:** ch5, dc in ch2-sp, \*ch1, (dc in next dc) x3, (dc, ch3, dc) in next dc, (dc in next dc) x3, ch1\*, (dc, ch3, dc) in ch3-sp, repeat \* to \* one more time, (dc, ch2, dc) in ch5-sp.

**Row 4:** ch5, dc in ch2-sp, \*ch1, dc in next dc, ch1, dc4tog in next 4 dc, ch5, dc4tog in ch3-sp, ch5, dc4tog in next 4 dc, ch1, dc in next dc, ch1\*, (dc, ch5, dc) in ch3-sp, repeat \* to \* one more time, (dc, ch2, dc) in ch5-sp.

**Row 5:** ch1, **sc** in beg. dc, \*ch5, sc in next dc, ch5, skip next dc, sc in ch1-sp before dc4tog, ch5, sc in ch5-sp, ch5, sc in ch5-sp, ch5, sc in ch1-sp after dc4tog, ch5, skip next dc, sc in next dc, ch5, **sc** in ch5-sp\*, repeat \* to \* one more time.

**Row 6:** **ch6**, \*dc7 in ch5-sp, \*\*ch2, sc in next ch5-sp, ch5, sc in next ch5-sp, ch2, dc7 in ch5-sp\*\*, repeat \*\* to \*\* to the last ch5-sp before marker\*, **ch3**, repeat \* to \* one more time, ch2, tr in marked sc.

**Row 7:** **ch5**, dc in ch2-sp, \*ch1, (dc in next dc) x3, (dc, ch3, dc) in next dc, (dc in next dc) x3, \*\*ch2, sc in ch5-sp, ch2, (dc in next dc) x3, (dc, ch3, dc) in next dc, (dc in next dc) x3\*\*, repeat \*\* to \*\* to dc before marker, ch1\*, (dc, **ch3**, dc) in marked ch3-sp, repeat \* to \* one more time, (dc, ch2, dc) in marked ch6-sp.

**Row 8:** **ch5**, dc in ch2-sp, \*ch1, dc in next dc, \*\*ch1, dc4tog in next 4 dc, ch5, dc4tog in ch3-sp, ch5, dc4tog in next 4 dc\*\*, repeat \*\* to \*\* to the last dc4 before marker, ch1, dc in next dc, ch1\*, (dc, **ch5**, dc) in marked ch3-sp, repeat \* to \* one more time, (dc, ch2, dc) in marked ch5-sp.

**Row 9:** ch1, **sc** in beg. dc, \*ch5, sc in next dc, ch5, skip next dc, sc in ch1-sp before dc4tog, \*\*ch5, sc in ch5-sp, ch5, sc in next ch5-sp, ch5, sc in ch1-sp after dc4tog\*\*, repeat \*\* to \*\* to last ch1-sp before marker, ch5, skip next dc, sc in next dc, ch5, **sc** in marked ch5-sp\*, repeat \* to \* one more time.

Repeat **rows 6 - 9** according to your preference. For the shawl in the pictures, I repeat 3 more times, for a total of 21 rows. Make sure to end with Row 9.

**Part B (for 2-color shawl, you need to use contrasting color yarn on rows 4, 5, 8, 9, and edging)**

**Row 1:** Same as Part A row 6

**Row 2:** Same as Part A row 7

**Row 3:** **ch5**, \*dc in next dc, skip ch1-sp, (dc in next dc) x4, ch2, dc in ch3-sp, ch2, (dc in next dc) x3, \*\*ch1, dc3tog in (next dc, sc, next dc), ch1, (dc in next dc) x3, ch2, dc in ch3-sp, ch2, (dc in next dc) x3\*\*, repeat \*\* to \*\* to last 3 dc's before marker, dc in next dc, skip ch1-sp, dc in next dc\*, **ch5**, repeat \* to \* one more time, ch2, dc in marked ch5-sp.

**Row 4:** ch10 (pm in **6th ch**), tr in ch2-sp, \*ch6, tr in dc between ch2, \*\*ch6, tr in dc3tog, ch6, tr in dc between ch2\*\*, repeat \*\* to \*\* to last dc between ch2 before marker, ch6\*, [tr, ch8 (**pm on 2nd and 7th ch**), tr] in marked ch5-sp, repeat \* to \* one more time, (tr, ch4, ttr) in marked ch5-sp.

**Row 5:** **ch5**, dc in base on ch5, ch1, dc3tog in (2nd ch of ch4-sp, tr, 3rd ch of next ch6-sp), \*\*ch1, dc in 5th ch of same ch6-sp, ch1, (dc, ch2, dc, ch2, dc) in next tr, ch1, dc in 2nd of next ch6-sp, ch1, dc3tog in (4th ch of same ch6-sp, tr, 3rd ch of next ch6-sp)\*\*, repeat \*\* to \*\* until you are about to make dc3tog in last tr before marker, dc3tog in (4th ch of same ch6-sp, tr, marked ch), ch1, (dc, ch1, dc, **ch5**, dc, ch1, dc) in ch8-sp before next marker, ch1, dc3tog in (marked ch, tr, 3rd ch of next ch6-sp), repeat \*\* to \*\* to last 2 ch before marker, ch1, (dc, ch2, dc) in marked ch.

**Row 6:** ch10 (pm in **6th ch**), tr in ch2-sp, \*ch6, tr in dc3tog, \*\*ch6, tr in dc between ch2-sp, ch6, tr in dc3tog\*\*, repeat \*\* to \*\* to last dc3tog before marker, ch6\*, [tr, ch8 (**pm on 2nd and 7th ch**), tr] in marked ch5-sp, repeat \* to \* one more time, (tr, ch4, ttr) in marked ch5-sp.

**Row 7:** **ch5**, dc in base on ch5, ch1, dc in 3rd ch of ch4-sp, ch1, (dc, ch2, dc, ch2, dc) in next tr, \*\*ch1, dc in 2nd of next ch6-sp, ch1, dc3tog in (4th ch of same ch6-sp, tr, 3rd ch of next ch6-sp), ch1, dc in 5th ch of same ch6-sp, ch1, (dc, ch2, dc, ch2, dc) in next tr\*\*, repeat \*\* to \*\* until you have made (dc, ch2, dc, ch2, dc) in last tr before marker, ch1, dc in marked ch, ch1, (dc, **ch5**, dc) in ch4-sp before next marker, ch1, dc in marked ch, ch1, (dc, ch2, dc, ch2, dc) in next tr, repeat \*\* to \*\* to last tr before marker, ch1, dc in 2nd ch of ch10-sp, ch1, (dc, ch2, dc) in marked ch.

**Row 8:** same as row 4.

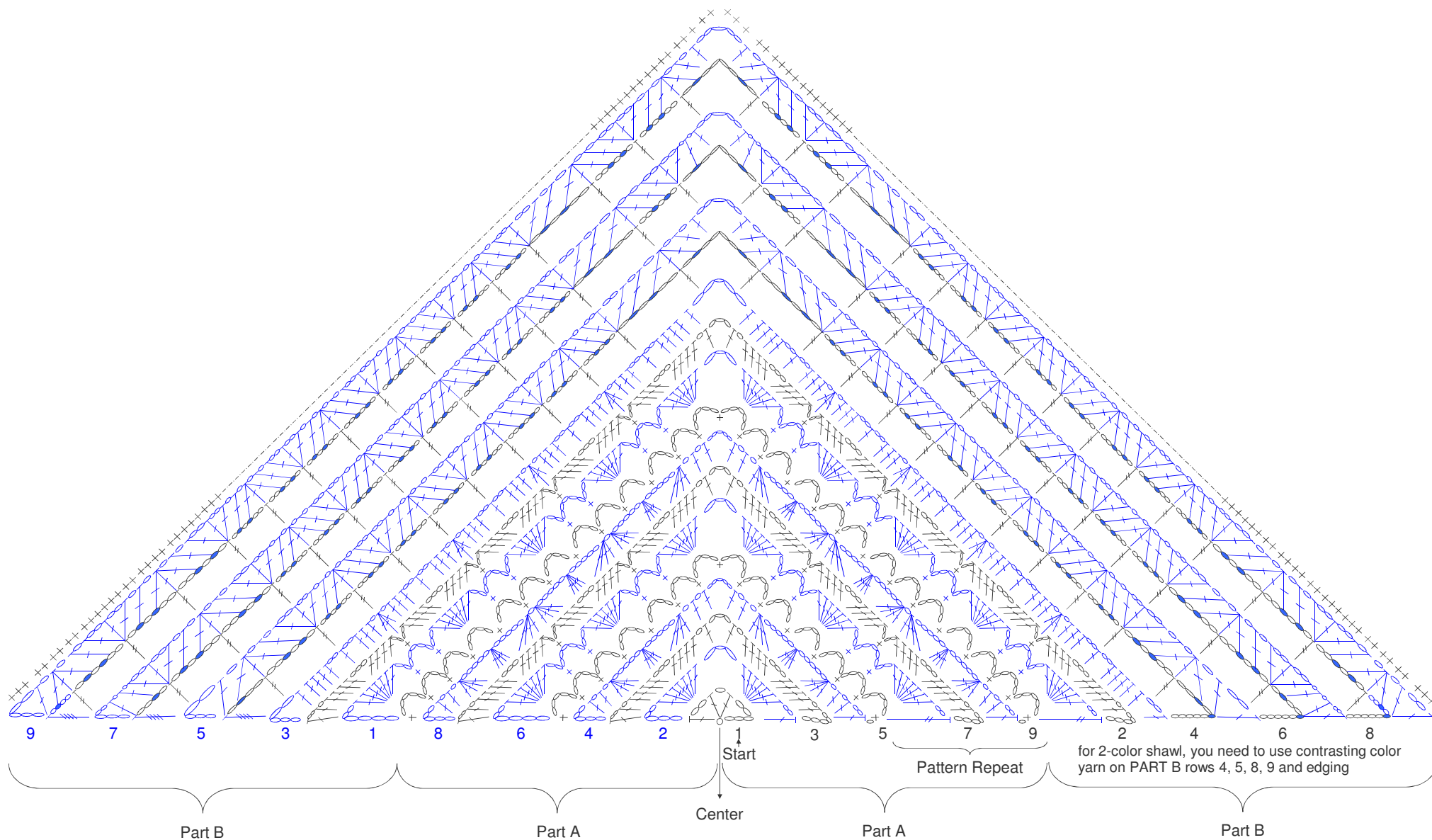
**Row 9:** same as row 5.

**Edging:** sc in each st around. Sl st at the end of the round, bind off, and block shawl to desired size.

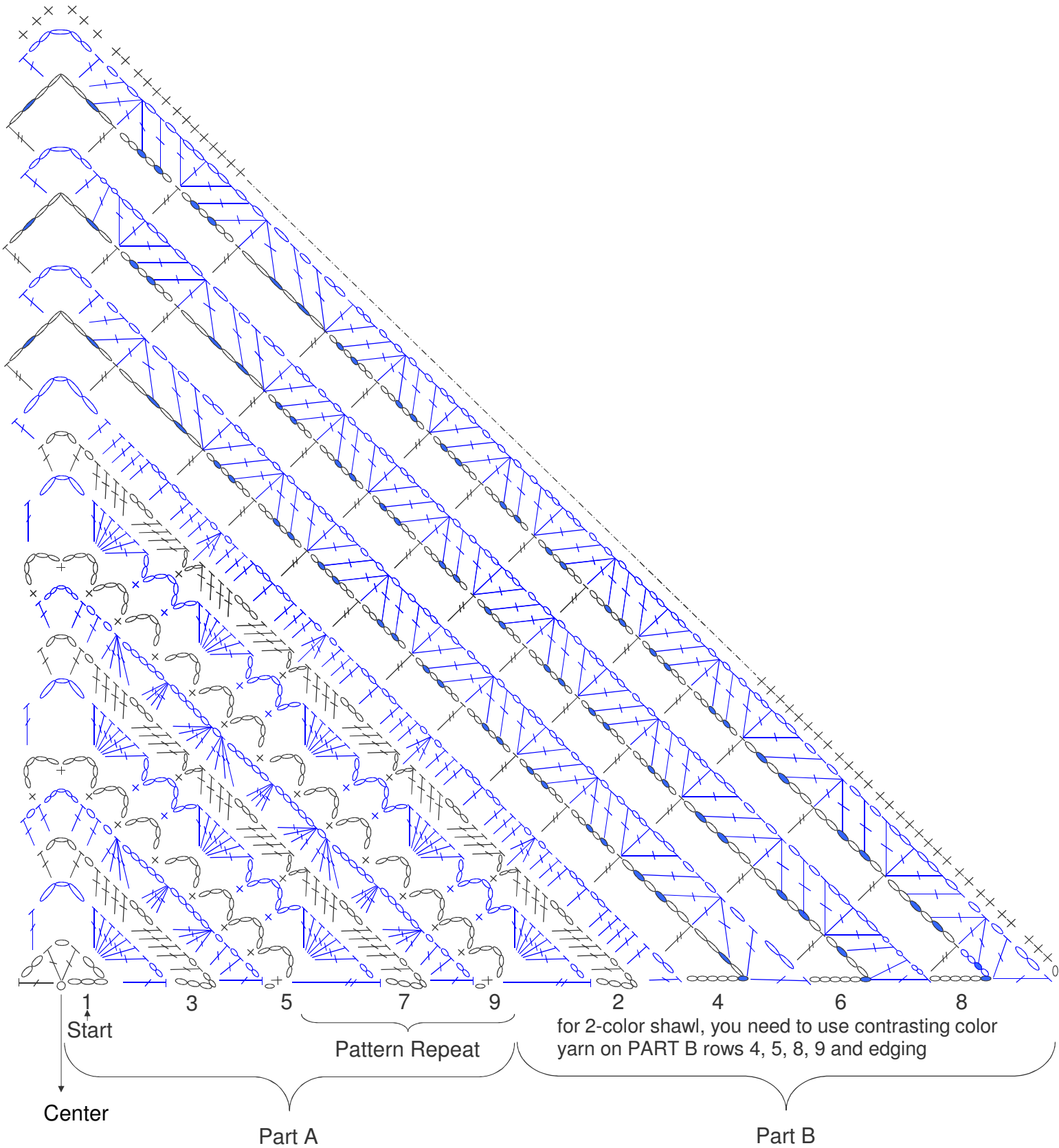
